OCTOBER'S CHARACTER TRAIT:

RESPECT

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This month's character trait is respect. Some aspects of respect are being considerate of the feelings of others, being tolerant and accepting of differences, and dealing peacefully when faced with anger, insults or disagreements. Use good manners, be polite and follow the Golden Rule—treating others the way we'd like others to treat us. When discussing this month's pillar, talk to your student about the importance of respect, whether it is for an adult, a friend, a stranger, or themselves. Having respect for others is critical for a child's future social success.

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ATTENDANCE REMINDER

Parents, please note that if a student misses 2 days a month, they are missing 20 days a year, 30 hours of math, 60 hours of reading and writing, and by the time they graduate, they will have missed an entire year of school.

If a student misses 4 days a month, they are missing 40 days for the year, 60 hours of math instruction, 120 hours of reading and writing, and by the time they graduate, they will have missed 2 full years of school.

Attendance is important to the success of your students! Please schedule appointments outside of school hours whenever possible.

DRESS CODE REMINDER

We require students to adhere to our uniform dress code. Solid-color polo shirts in the school colors—red (not maroon), white, or navy blue—are acceptable, as are Heritage polo shirts which are available in the office for \$12 each. Slacks, shorts, jumpers, capri pants, and skirts in khaki or navy blue can be worn, but no other "bottom" colors are permitted. Uniforms should not be either excessively baggy or too tight.
